The Owyhee County Fair Boundary Exception Petition was revised by the Owyhee County Fair Board in January of 2014. **Now, only those with MARKET LIVESTOCK PROJECTS need to complete a petition.** 

If you want to show and sell at the Owyhee County Fair . . .

## **YOU DO NOT NEED TO SUBMIT A PETITION IF:**

- 1. You live in Owyhee County.
- 2. You attend a school located in Owyhee County (Bruneau, Grand View, Homedale, Marsing, Pleasant Valley, Rimrock).
- 3. You do not live in Owyhee County but live in a school district located partially in Owyhee County (Melba or Owyhee, Nevada), or if you live in the Jordan Valley School District and are NOT taking a market livestock project.
- 4. You do not meet any of the above criteria and are NOT taking a market livestock project.

## YOU NEED TO SUBMIT A PETITION IF:

- 1. You do not live in Owyhee County but live in a school district located partially in Owyhee County (Melba or Owyhee, Nevada), or if you live in the Jordan Valley School District and are taking a market livestock project.
- 2. You do not meet any of the above criteria and want to petition the Fair Board for exception to the boundary rule and are taking a market livestock project.

## PLEASE REMEMBER:

- 1. Petitions must be submitted each year, no later than February 1.
- 2. Your address is where YOU LIVE. Please do not use someone else's address or make up an address. (See Rule 4(b), below)
- 3. In the event petitions are approved, petitioners must continue to be an active member of an Owyhee County 4-H club or FFA chapter and meet all project requirements.
- 4. Even though initially approved, Petitioner may NOT show or sell at the Fair if:
  - a. The 4-H Leader or FFA advisor does not sign off that all requirements have been met and project is complete; or,
  - b. Petitioner is found to have provided false information.
- 5. Approval of requests shall be granted or denied at the discretion of the Fair Board. Each year the Owyhee County Fair Board reserves the right to approve or deny petitions based on the space available at the fairgrounds. First priority will be given to Owyhee County residents, then those meeting the Boundary Exception requirements and, lastly, to those residing outside of Owyhee County who do not meet any of the Boundary Exception requirements.
- 6. All decisions of the Fair Board are final.

## Boundary Exception Petition for Showing and Marketing Livestock at the Owyhee County Fair

Non-residents of Owyhee County not attending an Owyhee County school, but attending a school in a school district located partly in Owyhee County, or living in the Jordan Valley school district, may petition for permission to participate in showing and marketing 4-H and FFA livestock at the Owyhee County Fair. Petitioners must belong to an Owyhee County 4-H club or school FFA chapter to be eligible for consideration. Petitioners must complete a petition, signed by their Parent/Guardian and 4-H leader or FFA advisor, and submit it annually no later than February 1 prior to the Fair.
