At 9:30 a.m. the departmental quarterly reports were submitted by Planning and Zoning, Assessor, Building Department, Probation, Coroner, Indigent and Charity, Recorder and Sheriff.

At 11:00 a.m. Nikki Zogg and Patty Foster with Southwest District Health Department met with the Board to go over the proposed fiscal year (FY) 2018 budget. The proposed budget is for \$8,972,552 at an increase of 3.4% over FY17. A proposal of a 3% increase in County contributions compared to FY17, an increase of \$37,919.

Eagle View Estates residents Jan Alexander and Daniel MacPherson met with the Board to discuss their concern with the road condition in their subdivision. The residents proposed the homeowners in the subdivision pay for the upgrading of the road condition and have the county take ownership of the road once that is complete. The Board explained that in order for the county to take over a road, the road must first be brought up to 'standards' which can be in the 100's of thousands of dollars, and that the county, because of limited resources, is not able to take on more roads to maintain at this time.

A discussion concerning the purchase of equipment for various taxing districts was held, no action was taken.

The Boise District BLM Coordination meeting was held at 1:30 p.m.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at approximately 3:00 p.m.
