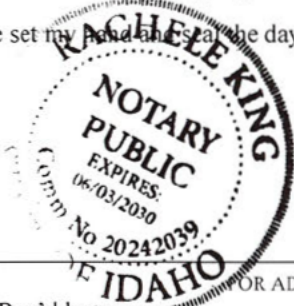

I am writing to formally apply for a building permit for a proposed residential and agricultural development on a potential property located at RP06S05E330300.

This project is intended to establish both a primary residence and an income-producing agricultural operation, with the horse training facility serving as the principal source of income.

The proposed development includes the following components:

1. Primary Residence:

1. Whether the intended use is necessary or desirable to the public convenience and welfare.

The proposed use includes a single-family residence and a small-scale horse training facility that is consistent with the rural and agricultural character of the area. The project promotes orderly land use, supports equestrian and agricultural activities common to the community, and contributes positively to the local economy and surrounding property maintenance.

2. Whether the proposed use may create a hazard, nuisance, detriment or other injury to other property in the immediate vicinity or to health or safety to the citizens of the county in general.

The proposed use is not anticipated to create hazards, nuisances, or detriment to neighboring properties or to the health and safety of county residents. The horse training operation will be limited in scale, will not include an indoor arena or large commercial barn facility, and is not expected to generate significant traffic, noise, dust, or lighting impacts. Routine manure removal and regular site maintenance will be conducted to minimize odors, pests, and sanitation concerns.

3. Whether essential public services, or the general public health or safety, or general public environment may be negatively impacted by such use or whether there may be a requirement of additional public funding in order to meet the needs created by the requested use.

The proposed residential and horse training use is not expected to negatively impact essential public services, public health, public safety, or the environment. Existing roads and infrastructure are adequate to accommodate the limited traffic associated with the use, and no unusual demand for additional public services or public funding is anticipated.

4. Whether adequate sewer, water and drainage facilities, and utilities and other service systems are to be provided by the applicant to accommodate said use.

Adequate sewer, water, drainage, utility, and service systems will be provided to accommodate the proposed use. The property will comply with all applicable county and utility requirements regarding water supply, wastewater disposal, stormwater drainage, and other necessary infrastructure. Drainage and manure management practices will be maintained to protect surrounding properties and water resources.

5. Whether the proposed use may have adverse impact on water supplies, both surface and underground.

The proposed use is not expected to adversely impact surface water or groundwater supplies. Manure will be routinely removed and managed appropriately to minimize

runoff or contamination risks. The project will comply with applicable environmental and stormwater management requirements.

6. Whether geological base on which the use is to be placed may or may not support the proposed use.

The site is suitable for the proposed residential and equestrian use and is capable of supporting the planned improvements and activities. Any required grading, drainage, or engineering measures will be completed in compliance with applicable county standards and building requirements.

7. Whether the proposed use at the site may endanger human health, animal life and plant life in the surrounding are and/or the county in general. (i.e. species of animals or plants, or their habitats which might be harmed or interfered with by the proposed use.

The proposed use is not expected to endanger human health, animal life, plant life, or surrounding habitats. The project consists of standard residential and small-scale equestrian activities that are compatible with the surrounding area. Ongoing maintenance and responsible animal management practices will minimize impacts to nearby properties and natural resources.

8. Whether the proposed use compliments, benefits, and is compatible with the surrounding land uses.

The proposed single-family residence and horse training use are compatible with the surrounding land uses and the rural character of the area. Equestrian and agricultural-related activities are consistent with nearby uses and are expected to complement the existing community character.

9. Whether special conditions could be imposed upon the proposed use which would so minimize any adverse impact as to justify the granting of the conditional use permit. In responding to the point, please consider and propose any special conditions which the commission could issue which would minimize or mitigate any adverse impact as described in all of the above questions.

The applicant is willing to comply with reasonable conditions imposed by the county to minimize any potential impacts associated with the project. Such conditions may include limitations on the scale of operations, maintenance of manure management practices, compliance with drainage and erosion control requirements, restrictions on excessive outdoor lighting or noise, and adherence to all applicable building, zoning, health, and safety regulations. The applicant will continue routine manure removal and

property maintenance to ensure the site remains clean and compatible with surrounding uses.

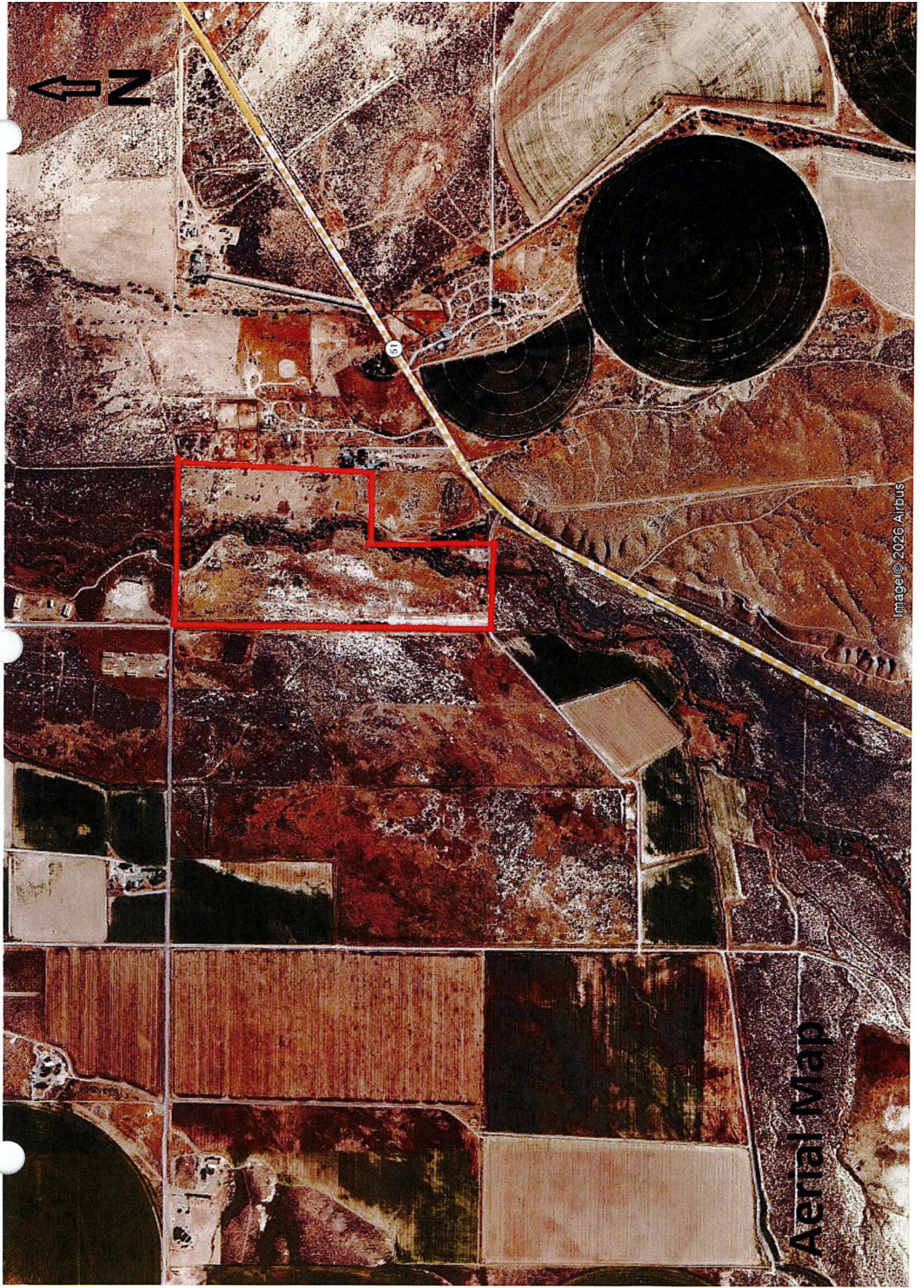


Vicinity Map

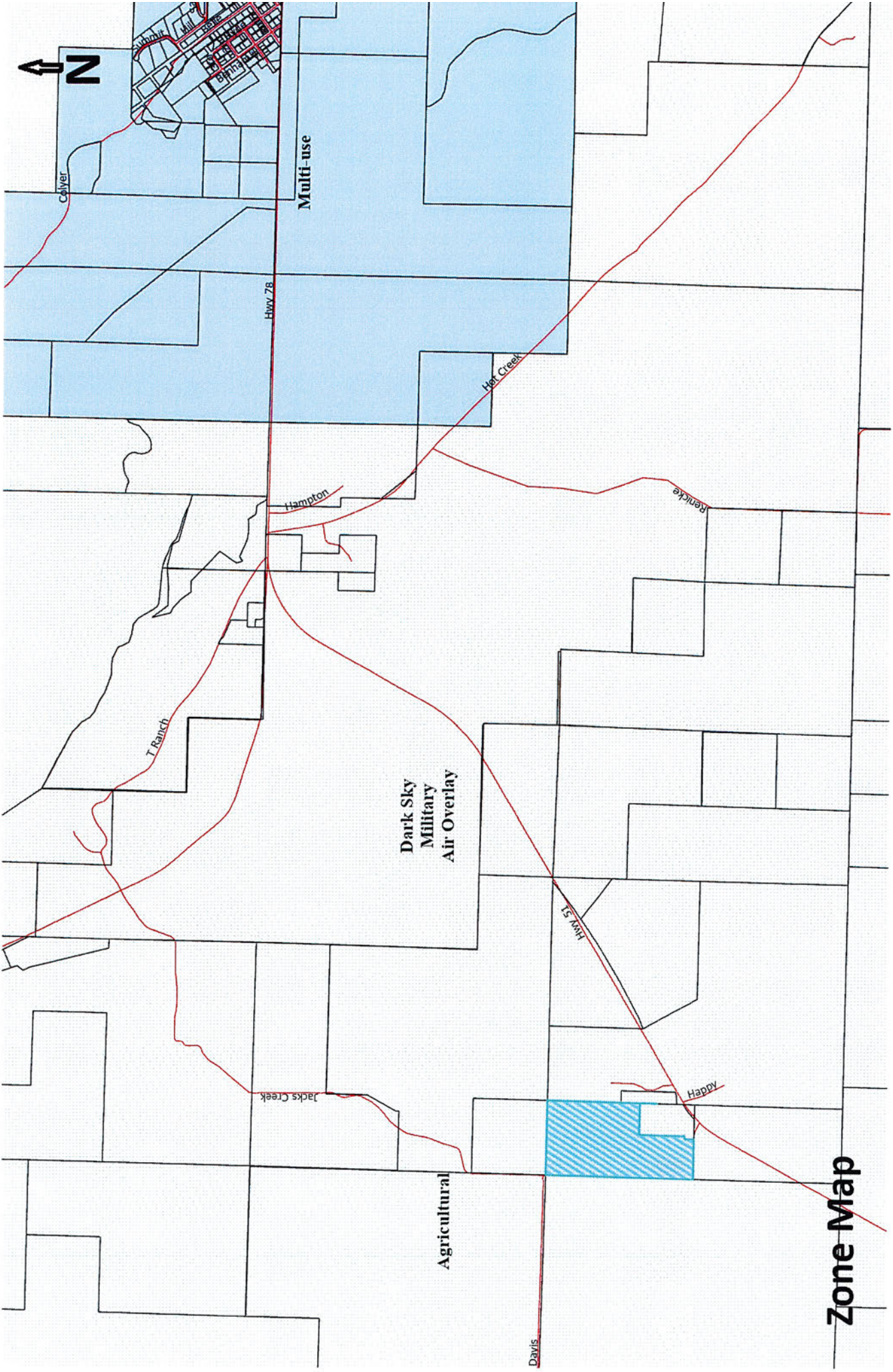

Description

ENG - Engineering

Dwellings are single-family houses of three stories or less. For dwellings without basements, the foundation is assumed to consist of spread footings of reinforced concrete built on undisturbed soil at a depth of 2 feet or at the depth of maximum frost penetration, whichever is deeper.

The ratings for dwellings are based on the soil properties that affect the capacity of the soil to support a load without movement and on the properties that affect excavation and construction costs. The properties that affect the load-supporting capacity include depth to a water table, ponding, flooding, subsidence, linear extensibility (shrink-swell potential), and compressibility. Compressibility is inferred from the Unified classification of the soil. The properties that affect the ease and amount of excavation include depth to a water table, ponding, flooding, slope, depth to bedrock or a cemented pan, hardness of bedrock or a cemented pan, and the amount and size of rock fragments.

The ratings are both verbal and numerical. Rating class terms indicate the extent to which the soils are limited by all of the soil features that affect the specified use. "Not limited" indicates that the soil has features that are very favorable for the specified use. Good performance and very low maintenance can be expected. "Somewhat limited" indicates that the soil has features that are moderately favorable for the specified use. The limitations can be overcome or minimized by special planning, design, or installation. Fair performance and moderate maintenance can be expected. "Very limited" indicates that the soil has one or more features that are unfavorable for the specified use. The limitations generally cannot be overcome without major soil reclamation, special design, or expensive installation procedures. Poor performance and high maintenance can be expected.

Numerical ratings indicate the severity of individual limitations. The ratings are shown as decimal fractions ranging from 0.01 to 1.00. They indicate gradations between the point at which a soil feature has the greatest negative impact on the use (1.00) and the point at which the soil feature is not a limitation (0.00).
